

In general

- Most clubs are located in Southern Norway
- Southern Norway Western part
 - Mountain area with 3 clubs
 - Biggest (and the only one thats active all the time) is Os Aero Klubb located south of Bergen
 - Stunning scenery, the perfect place to learn mountain flying and a great place to visit
 - Possibility to receive mountain flying instruction in Duo Discus before exploring the mountains with you own glider
- Southern Norway Eastern Part
 - Flat area with wide valleys, fields and forests
 - Ole Reistad Senter at Starmoen airfield
 - Far inland, alot of good weather for XC (cross country flying)
 - Good landout possibilities
 - Location for the Norwegian Nationals, NorgesCup, Nordic 2010 and alot of other competitions
 - Easy place to fly XC, even for inexperienced pilots. Also a good place to stay (good facilities)
- Northern Norway
 - One Club: Salangen
 - Small club, just started
 - Stunning place to fly! (Mountains, midnight sun etc)



Typical Weather (good days)

- Streets of thermals forming along the hills
- Cloudbase above 2000 meters
- Strong climbs over forest areas
- Not too windy
- 200-500km





Starmoen Airfield, Elverum

- 1200 meters of tarmac and grass 200 meters wide
- Tarmac on parking and taxiway making it easy to handle the gliders on ground
- Excellent facilities with several options for costs/comfort
- Whinch and aerotowing for takeoff
- Located 1:30h drive from Gardermoen
- Free airspace up to FL95 above airfied
- Gliding sectors in Oslo Gardermoen TMA
- Good place to fly XC, also for inexcperienced pilots
- Home of ORS Ole Reistad Senter, the National Gliding Center of Norway

- Many young members
- Skilled flight instructors and trainers
- Familiarity flights and mountain training in our Duo Discus XLT

- Picture shows one of the local landouts
- Landout Catalouge
- Map of most landouts
- Most Waypoints are Landouts
- TMA Follow the ridges to freedom
- Gliding Areas to be opened like in Denmark (ref. Billund)

- Spectacular landscape
- Good thermal conditions —
 Especially during springtime
- It's possible to fly XC along the ridges from the airfield
- Good place for the young and poor (but bring your own beer)
- Perfect place to learn mountain flying
- 100-400km

Bømoen Airfield

- 80km from Ulven
- 1000x30 meters of tarmac
- Same "rules" as for Ulven
- The perfect location for your first solo flights
 - in mountains
- Free airspace up to FL95/FL115
- Summercamp each year All pilots welcome!











- Yes, in Norway we fly on Ice!
- Vågå Wavecamp is also called "The extreme altitude challenge"
 - 5000 meters is normal
- 10 000 meters is possible N-GRR
